PA-509: There was a significant increase in the # of unsheltered in 2013 PIT count (173), as compared to the last unsheltered count in 2011 (33). This includes 133 persons counted in encampments in the woods throughout Monroe County, an area not canvassed before. In 2011, Monroe reported zero unsheltered. The following counties also reported an increase in the # of unsheltered: Northampton (+5), Schuylkill (+12), Wayne (+3). Lehigh (-11) & Tioga (-2) counties reported reduced #s.
