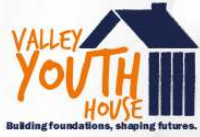

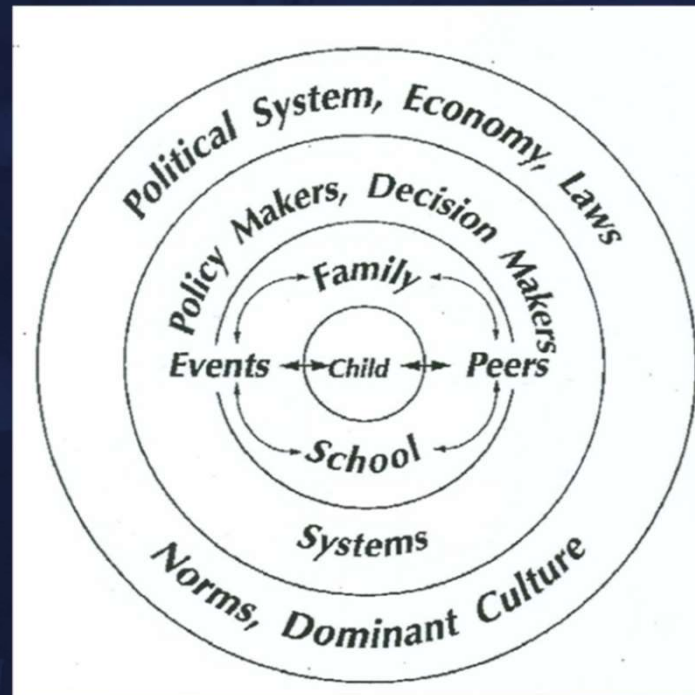
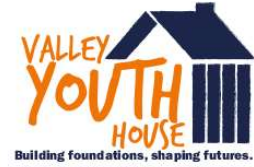

### Traditional Youth Services

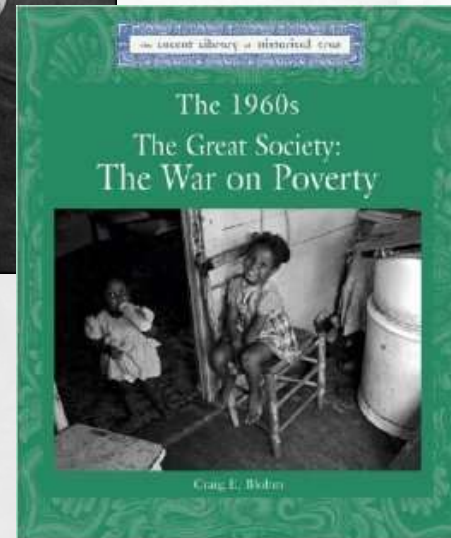
- Focus on problems

## The academic definition

“A process of human growth through which adolescents move from being taken care of to taking care of themselves and others; an approach where policy, funding, and programming are directed at providing supports to young people as they build their capacities and strengths to meet their personal and social needs; and a set of practices that adults use to provide youth with the types of relationships and experiences needed to fuel healthy development”

*(Youth Development Strategies, Inc; 2008)*

“An approach to working with young people that focuses on psychological, emotional and social development rather than problems or deficits”

## The Four Basic Areas of PYHD



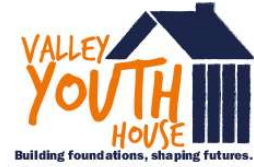
- **Safety**

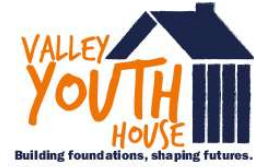

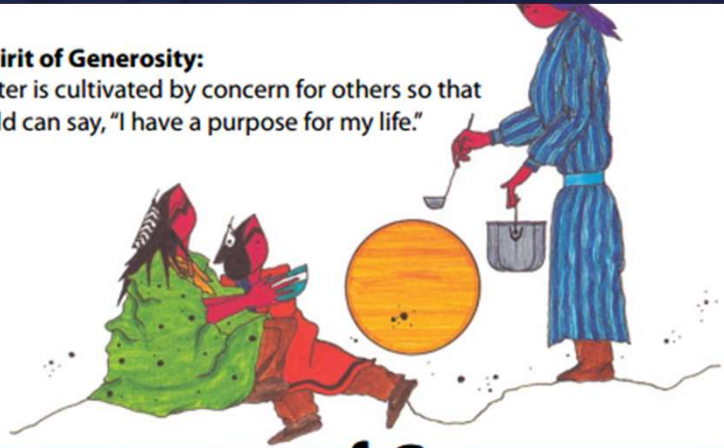

Character is cultivated by concern for others so that the child can say, "I have a purpose for my life."



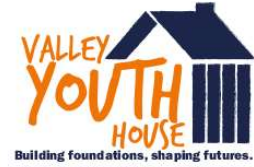


## Community Service VS Service Learning

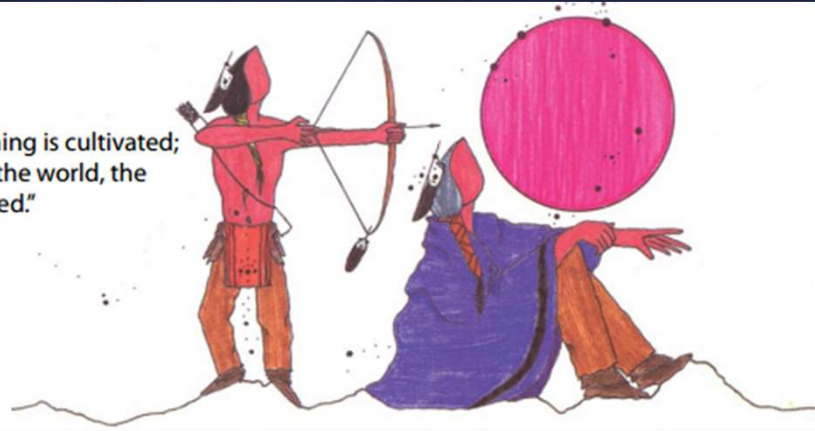


	Community Service	Service Learning
<b>Primary Intended Beneficiary</b>	Recipient(s)	Recipient(s) and Provider
<b>Primary Focus</b>	Providing meaningful service	Providing meaningful service and enhancing classroom learning
<b>Intended Educational Purpose</b>	Moral, personal and social growth and development	Academic learning, enhancing intellectual and civic engagement
<b>Curricular Integration</b>	None	Fully integrated into the curriculum
<b>Nature of Service Activity</b>	Based on client interest/motivation	Based on treatment plan or goals

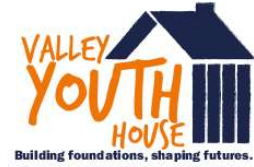
# COMPETENCE

child can say, "I can succeed."



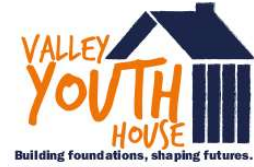
# CONFIDENCE

Free will is cultivated by responsibility so that the child can say, "I have the power to make decisions."



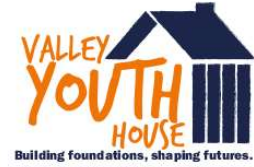
# CONNECTION



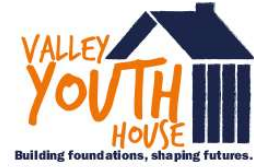
**The Spirit of Belonging:**

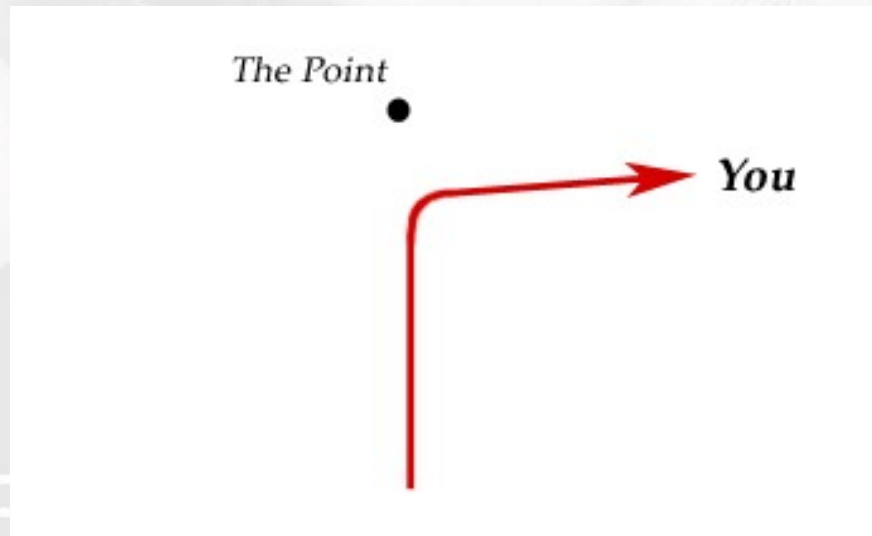
## #1 – Client Participation is PYD





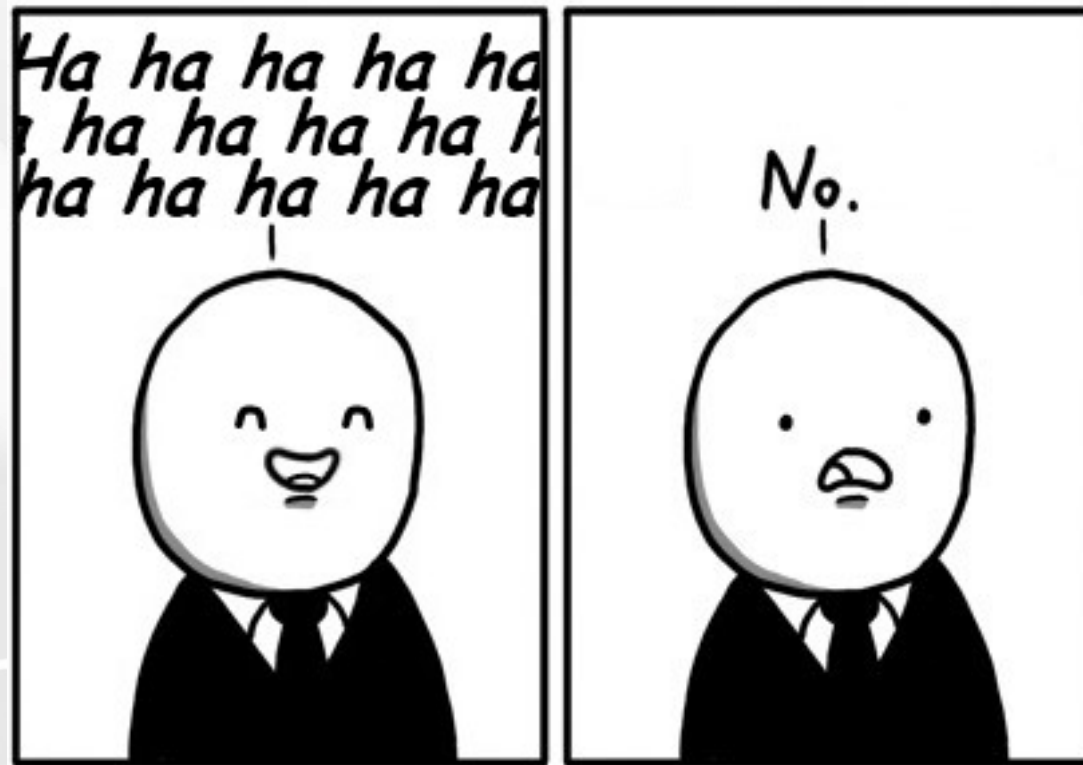
## #2 – Client Participation is important because it improves programs by considering their input and perspectives
