Approval of November Meeting Minutes

The motion to approve the November 16th meeting minutes passed with all in favor.

Ratification of items pre-approved by the Executive Committee

The Coordinated Entry Committee Recommendation to proceed in the same fashion it did for replacing Helen (former Pocono RHAB CE Regional Manager) to select a new organization and staff to replace Zenayda was approved with all in favor.

HMIS Resourcing Discussion

Jackie Condor

Angela requested additional time (until June 2021) to assess the need for additional HMIS resources/ staffing as HMIS has been in flux for many months, making it difficult to fully assess and identify what is needed. The Board requested to continue this discussion, not waiting until June 2021. Leigh recommended that if there is new CoC funding in 2020, the Board discuss the possibility of accessing CoC funding to support Mahendra's position long-term, which is currently being supported with ESG-CV funding.

Approval of Allocation of Planning Grant Funding to Support Engagement with People with Lived Expertise Lauren provided an updated budget for compensating people with lived expertise for their engagement on the CoC Board and Committees based on December 8th Board meeting input. The Board expressed concern about allocating both Travel and Other Project funding toward this activity. The motion to allocate the \$5,000 Planning Grant Board Travel line item toward supporting people with lived expertise engage in CoC Board and Committees was approved with all in favor.

Approval of 2021 Sheltered PIT Count Methodology

Shared with the Board in advance of the meeting, Leigh reviewed the 2021 PIT Count Methodology, how the Sheltered Methodology is the same as last year's with some COVID-19 related tweaks and how there will not be an unsheltered PIT Count this year. Mae-Ling motioned to approve the 2021 Sheltered PIT Count Methodology. Jeannette seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all in favor.

2020 CoC NOFA Update

To date, no CoC NOFA. HUD still waiting on Congress to pass legislation that will allow them to auto-renew CoC renewal grants.

Proposed Projects for repurposing DMA hours that would have otherwise been spent on the 2020 CoC NOFA Leigh presented that DMA has a max of 328 hours available to repurpose, assuming no additional NOFA for FY2020. Leigh walked through proposed projects. Leslie requested that Leigh prepare an estimated number of hours for each project the Board identified as a priority. Alisa commented that the Board could use some of their \$9600 Other Project BLI to supplement these projects, if there aren't enough repurposed hours. Some initial priorities identified included:

- project monitoring and self-monitoring tools
- propping up RRH; RRH Learning Collaborative
- Move-On Strategy
- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee Support
- New CoC Board member onboarding

Coordinated Entry Committee Recommendations

Jason presented the following 2 Coordinated Entry Recommendations: Adopt the New CoC Homelessness Prevention Toolkit to be implemented by ESG HP providers by February 1, 2021 and Adopt the New Homelessness Prevention Workflow in PA HMIS to reduce call wait times for Category 1 Literally Homeless and Category 4 Fleeing households. The Board discussed whether or not the tool can be built into HMIS, timeline, etc. Jason advised that the triage eligibility spreadsheet the Access Sites and 211 will use can be built into HMIS by the DCED HMIS team, but there is no timeline for that to date. Regarding building the HP Prioritization Tool into HMIS, Leigh advised that the Western PA CoC would likely be interested in pursuing that as well and splitting the costs. Sergio and Tiffany volunteered to pilot the tool in January.

The Board approved the Committee Recommendations with all in favor, with the goal of rolling out the Homelessness Prevention Prioritization Tool with ESG HP providers first and assessing ongoing expanding the requirement to other funding streams such as HAP and Home4Good. HP providers not funded by ESG will be welcome to use the tool voluntarily when it is launched.

CDC Eviction Moratorium Advocacy Effort Discussion

The Board discussed sending a letter to Congressional leadership the way they had to the Governor and Secretary of Health.
