



- Renewal Summary Form Survey:
 - Please submit a separate renewal summary form survey for each
 2021 CoC project renewal within your organization.

- You will required to submit/upload required attachments in order to submit this survey form. Required attachments include: 1) ELOCCS summary page, 2) documentation of APR Submission Date. Instructions are provided in the survey regarding these required documents. In addition:
 - If you did not draw down 90% of your project grant during your last grant year you
 will be required to submit supplemental information about prior and current draw
 down rates.
 - If your project was monitored by HUD in the last two years you will be required to submit supplemental information.
- You will also have the opportunity to submit/upload attachments for bonus points related to Equity. You can find a copy of the Organizational Equity Self-Assessment Tool attached to this email. Instructions related to submitting the tool are included in the Renewal Summary Form survey.
- **DV Providers:** You will also be required to submit/upload your APR from your DV comparable database.

- You will receive an automatic response by email with a copy of your submissions when you complete each survey.
- Preliminary Outcomes and Scoring Report: Once data has been submitted, DMA staff will compile
 and review the data and materials submitted. The CoC will release a report showing preliminary
 outcomes and scores for each criterion by June 25th. Please note that there will be only one
 version of the preliminary outcomes and scoring report. CoC agencies are expected to carefully
 review the preliminary outcomes and scoring report and identify any issues that the agency
 perceives to be incorrect.
- Appeals: Upon release of the preliminary outcomes and scoring report, the window for submitting appeals of the outcomes and scoring will be open. The window for submitting appeals will be from June 28th to July 2nd. DMA will provide instructions on how to submit an appeal. The appeal process will be the only opportunity agencies will have to identify and bring outcomes/scoring issues to the attention of the Funding Committee once preliminary outcomes and scoring have been released. DMA will conduct an initial review of all appeals submitted. Errors in calculations will be corrected by DMA. DMA will provide the Funding Committee with information on all appeals and the Funding Committee will review appeals and determine the outcome of each appeal. Agencies that filed appeals will be notified of Funding Committee's determination.

- Final scores will be released once funding committee reviews/makes decisions related to appeals, and once agencies have been notified about appeal decisions.
- The renewal scoring process will conclude by mid-July.

CoC Funding Policies (described the project-level review and ranking process that is used by the CoC to determine how CoC Program project applications submitted to the CoC are reviewed, scored, and ranked)



CoC-funding Process and Policies

This policy document was submitted to the Eastern PA CoC Governing Board for approval and adoption on March 15, 2021.

Eastern PA CoC - PA-509

Each year, the Eastern PA Continuum of Care (CoC) applies to the U.S. Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for homeless assistance funding to address the needs of individuals and families experiencing homelessness throughout its 33-county region. The availability of funding is announced through HUD's CoC Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA), a national funding competition.

In response to HUD's CoC NOFA, the Eastern PA CoC will conduct a fair, transparent funding process, that complies with CoC Regulations, specifically § 578.95 Conflicts of interest, which covers CoC Board members, organizational conflicts and other conflicts.

Vision, Mission and Guiding Principles

Vision:

- Homelessness will be rare, brief and a one-time experience in our community
- Our system will meet people where they are and support them in obtaining and retaining housing
- Our system will be sustainable, with enough resources to provide housing and services to those experiencing homelessness according to their individual needs
- Our system will work with mainstream systems to maximize resources for those we serve

Mission: The mission of the CoC is to end homelessness throughout its 33-county geographic region.

Guiding Principles:

- Ending homelessness is possible
- Homelessness should not define those who experience it
- Housing is essential to ending homelessness
- "The whole is greater than the sum of its parts"
 - o We must work together as a cohesive system in order to reach our goal
 - We must engage with the wider community
 - We must be strategic in how we use our resources

Funding Allocations, per Eastern PA CoC Governance Charter

In 2013, when the Eastern PA CoC was established through the merger of the Central-Harrisburg and Northeast regional CoCs, the 33-county geography was divided into five regions. At that time, an "Annual Renewal Demand" or ARD was established to represent the amount of CoC funding allocated to each region. The purpose of the regional ARD was to set a baseline for monitoring the movement of CoC funding across the different regions in order to preserve the geographic diversity of funding. Per the CoC's Governance Charter, the regional ARD is to inform all funding decisions, including in specific situations such as: funding reduction of a specific project, funding reduction of all CoC-funded projects; or an increase in the funding allocation. From the Governance Charter:

Reduction of a Specific Grant

In the event that an individual grant no longer exists or for which funding must be reduced or reallocated, any remaining grant funds shall be reallocated first to the county in which this grant is located. If there are no qualified applications in the county, these funds will be made available to the RHAB of the affected grantee. If there are no qualified applications in the affected RHAB, the remaining grant funds shall be returned to the full Eastern PA CoC and the Board of Directors shall solicit funding applications from all remaining RHABs. The Funding Committee will recommend the redistribution of funds between RHABs, as needed in order to ensure all available funding is allocated. The Board agrees to adopt the recommendations of the Funding Committee in such cases. If the remaining grant funds are ultimately reallocated to a different RHAB, then the ARD Percentage shall be adjusted to reflect the new funding distribution.

Across the Board Funding Reductions

In the event that the Board of Directors determines that there is insufficient funding to service all existing grants, the Board would accept recommendations from the Funding Committee to determine how funding reductions would be made. The Funding Committee will attempt to apply any required reductions equitably among all RHABs in accordance with the percentage cut required, HUD mandated policies and funding priorities.

Increase in Funding Allocations

In the event that HUD increases the total amount of available funding to the CoC, through a "bonus," increase in annual pro-rata allocation, or any other method, any such funding increase shall be distributed according to HUD mandated policies and funding priorities at the discretion of the Funding Committee. The Funding Committee will determine if these funds should be distributed to each RHAB based on the most current ARD percentage, or if the funds will be strategically allocated to communities based on unmet needs or other priorities of the CoC.

If the Funding Committee determines that the increased funding shall be proportionately distributed to each RHAB based on the established pro-rata, and any RHAB is unable to utilize any amount of the increased funding allocation, these excess funds will be returned to the full CoC and the Funding Committee shall solicit funding applications from all remaining RHABs. Under these circumstances, the Governing Board will adopt the recommendations of the Funding Committee to

ensure that all available funds are requested through the CoC's application to HUD. If the remaining grant funds are ultimately redistributed to a different RHAB, then the ARD Percentage shall be adjusted to reflect the new funding distribution.

Roles and Responsibilities

As detailed below, the annual funding process is shared across many different entities within the CoC.

Eastern PA CoC Governing Board

The Eastern PA CoC Governing Board is charged with fulfilling the mission of the CoC, as well as functioning as the designated primary decision-making entity to meet the duties and responsibilities of the CoC.

Responsibilities of the Governing Board, as they pertain to CoC funding:

- Design and oversee a collaborative process for selecting and ranking project applications, in conjunction with the Funding Committee;
- Adopt the recommendations of the Funding Committee; and
- Provide input for the CoC Planning Grant funds to the Collaborative Applicant. (The CoC Planning Grant funds are used to provide ongoing support to the CoC and fulfill HUD requirements such as the point-in-time count and the CoC application.)

Non-Conflicted Members of the Eastern PA CoC Governing Board

Non-conflicted members of the Eastern PA CoC Governing Board are defined as Board members who are not recipients or subrecipients of CoC funding, nor are applying for new project funding as a recipient or sub-recipient.

The role of the non-conflicted members of the Eastern PA CoC Governing Board will be to review a second appeal submitted by project applicants, if the project applicant submitted an appeal to the Funding Committee but was not satisfied with the outcome. This would apply to renewal project applicants that lose points during the renewal scoring process, renewal project applicants subject to full or partial reallocation, and new project applicants who are not selected for funding, or are conditionally selected based on project changes requested by the CoC's Funding Committee. The decision made by the non-conflicted members of

the Eastern PA CoC Governing Board will be considered the final decision.

Collaborative Applicant

The PA Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED), in their role as Collaborative Applicant, is designated by the Continuum of Care to collect and submit the CoC Registration, Grant Inventory Worksheet, and CoC Consolidated Application (which includes the CoC Application and CoC Priority Listing). In addition, DCED will apply for CoC Planning Grant funding, with input and approval from the CoC Board.

Funding Committee

Regulatory requirements state that funding decisions be made by representatives that do not receive CoC funding (established in 24 CFR Part 578). Therefore, the CoC will establish a Funding Committee with the composition and responsibilities described below.

Composition of Funding Committee

In order to ensure a strong and transparent funding process, the Eastern PA CoC has established a Funding Committee, including the following as voting members:

- Two (2) non-conflicted representatives from each of the CoC's five (5) Regional Homeless Advisory Boards (RHABs), which includes the Chair of the Funding Committee
 - Non-conflicted Funding Committee members are defined as RHAB members who are not recipients or subrecipients of CoC funding, nor are applying for new project funding as a recipient or sub-recipient.
- Representative of the Collaborative Applicant (DCED)
 - As the CoC's HMIS Lead Agency, DCED applies for CoC funding to support the operation of HMIS. However, DCED is seen as non-conflicted because the HMIS grant is ranked in Tier 1 as a project that supports the CoC's infrastructure. In order to maintain the integrity of the CoC's funding process, DCED will not participate in any conversations about the ranking of the HMIS grant.

Consulting and staff support will be provided by the following non-voting participants:

- Staff from Diana T. Myers and Associates provides consulting services regarding the CoC NOFA competition and application through the Eastern PA CoC's Planning grant
- CoC Staff Person will provide administrative support where needed
- DCED CoC Staff will provide administrative support where needed

Each RHAB appoints two (2) non-conflicted representatives to the Funding Committee with the following terms:

- Funding Committee members must participate in at least 50% of meetings or they may be asked to step down from their position.
- RHABs may choose to appoint a new Funding Committee representative every two (2) years.

• Funding Committee members may choose to step down at any time. If a Funding Committee member chooses to step down, they will notify their RHAB co-chairs and the Funding Committee chair within five (5) days.

When there is a member vacancy, the co-chairs for that RHAB will work with their membership to fill the vacancy with a non-conflicted representative. Upon selection of a representative to fill the vacancy, the RHAB co-chairs will be responsible for notifying the Funding Committee Chair and CoC Consultant of the name, organization and contact information for the new representative for the RHAB.

Responsibilities of the Funding Committee

The Funding Committee will be responsible for operating and following a collaborative process for selecting and ranking project applications and ensuring the strategic use of HUD funds and other resources available to the CoC, in collaboration with the Governing Board. Specific responsibilities include:

- Review and update the Funding Policies on an annual basis;
- Finalize scoring criteria for renewal projects;
- Identify funding priorities, based on the CoC's gap analysis and input from CoC Board, RHABs, Committees, and membership;
- Review and finalize new project solicitations and new project scoring criteria, as needed;
- Review new project applications and approve/deny funding requests, based on the CoC's priorities;
- Review and make determination regarding appeals of new project applications not selected and/or selected for funding based on changes to the project requested by the Committee;
- Review and approve/deny appeals regarding renewal project scoring;
- Review and approve/deny appeals regarding the reallocation (full or partial) of CoC project funds;
- Determine the ranking of renewal and new projects as required by HUD.

Regional Homeless Advisory Boards (RHABs)

The CoC's five RHABs meet and conduct business throughout the year and coordinate with local providers to meet the CoC's goals.

As time permits, responsibilities of the RHABs, in relationship to the CoC NOFA, include:

- Providing input on the renewal scoring criteria, which is to be used to inform the recommendations from the CoC Consultant to the Funding Committee;
- Providing input for the prioritization of the region's needs, including recommendations that inform the priority needs; and
- Identifying additional resources available for households experiencing homelessness, as well as local gaps in supports and services; and
- Developing recommendations for funding allocations to submit to the Funding Committee for consideration.

Guiding Principles for Project Evaluation, Reallocation, Selection and Ranking

The CoC seeks to conduct a fair, unbiased process in which projects are selected and ranked according to project performance, CoC priorities and local need, and federal priorities.

Guiding Principles for Project Evaluation, Reallocation, Selection and Ranking

The Eastern PA CoC seeks to achieve the following goals as part of the evaluation and ranking of CoC-funded renewal projects:

- Maximize funding available to end homelessness throughout the CoC;
- Prioritize available funding for projects that are most successful in ending homelessness;
- Create new resources in order to respond to the increased needs identified in many communities within the CoC;
- Build upon the CoC's existing infrastructure by increasing capacity to quickly identify individuals
 experiencing homelessness, prioritize assistance toward those with the greatest needs, and rapidly
 connect households to permanent housing;
- Incentivize all CoC-funded providers to continuously monitor and improve their project performance, implement HUD policy priorities, and participate in the CoC meetings, committees and other initiatives.

Upon the availability of new or reallocated funds, the CoC will conduct a fair, open and transparent process to select new projects. Priorities for new projects will be established by the Funding Committee to reflect HUD priorities and CoC needs as identified through RHAB input and data regarding gaps and unmet needs. New project selection will be based on criteria outlined by the CoC through a new project solicitation process.

The CoC will also conduct a fair and transparent process regarding the ranking and tiering of projects to be included on the Priority List. Ranking and tiering decisions will be informed by CoC and HUD priorities, as well as local needs and project performance.

Renewal Project Evaluation and Scoring Policy

On an annual basis, the Eastern PA CoC establishes scoring standards to evaluate and score HUD CoCfunded renewal projects in preparation for the ranking of projects for the NOFA. In order to determine whether renewal projects are performing well or underperforming, each project's performance will be evaluated in the following areas:

- HUD policy priorities, including vulnerability and Housing First
- Performance outcomes, including exits to permanent housing, returns to homelessness, and increases in income
- Grant management, including unit utilization, percent of funds expended, and cost effectiveness
- CoC Participation, including attendance at CoC/RHAB meetings and training
- HMIS participation, including data quality

Process for Developing the Renewal Project Scoring Sheet

The CoC uses a Renewal Scoring Sheet to list and describe the scoring criteria to be used to evaluate and score renewal projects. This Sheet includes the annual criteria, as well as the data source and point structure for each criterion. Renewal projects will be scored in accordance with the Renewal Project Scoring Sheet, which will be developed through the process described below:

- Solicit input from CoC-funded grantees on the criteria included in the prior year's renewal project scoring sheet. This input will be requested via email and distributed to all CoC-funded projects, as well as the CoC's entire mailing list and posted on Workplace for Facebook, the CoC's interactive communication tool used for collaboration.
- Any type of feedback will be accepted. Specific feedback desired includes: ways that the renewal scoring criteria may negatively impact a group/class of projects (e.g., projects with a small number of units, projects serving families w/children, DV projects, etc.).
 - RHAB Co-Chairs may also be asked to facilitate a local discussion regarding the renewal scoring criteria and will provide feedback to the CoC Consultant (DMA - Diana T. Myers & Associates, Inc.). The Consultant will review this input in conjunction with considerations and provide recommendations for modifications to the renewal project scoring sheet to the Funding Committee.
- Analysis of the prior year's point structure is conducted by the CoC's Consultant. The purpose of
 this analysis is to ensure adequate distribution of points, particularly on performance-related
 criteria. This will help to determine if the benchmarks are set to encourage strong outcomes,
 without favoring certain types of projects (e.g., projects with turnover that are serving the CoC's
 most vulnerable households vs. projects with no turnover that are serving more stable clients).
- Present the above information to the Funding Committee. This group will discuss, finalize and approve the renewal project scoring sheet.
- Upon approval, final renewal project scoring sheet and all related policies will be publicly posted to the CoC's website and distributed to CoC-funded agencies via email.
- Scoring of renewal projects commences following the approval of the Renewal Scoring Project
 Sheet and associated policies.

Renewal Project Scoring Process

Evaluation and scoring of CoC-funded renewal projects will inform project ranking and tiering for the CoC NOFA competition. With the exception of CoC-level infrastructure (e.g., HMIS and Coordinated Entry grants), the CoC will follow the below process for scoring renewal projects that have operated throughout the entire data lookback period:

• In advance of and/or in tandem with the renewal scoring process (depending on the timeline of the release of the NOFA), the CoC's Consultant (DMA) will send instructions to grantees to review their data in HMIS, using a common time period (most recently completed HUD year - October to September), including instructions on cleaning up their data if needed. Grantees may reach out to the DCED HMIS team with questions or issues related to their data. DMA will aim to give grantees 2-4 weeks to review and clean up their data, depending on the timeline of the release of the NOFA.

- The CoC's Consultant (DMA) will distribute a Renewal Summary Form to all CoC-funded renewal project applicants, requesting data and information. This form will identify the data/information requested, the process for submitting that information, as well as the timeline/deadline.
 - Projects operated by Domestic Violence organizations will be asked to provide an APR or will be provided with an expanded Renewal Summary Form, as Victim Service Providers do not enter data into PA-HMIS.
- Renewal scoring results will be circulated to all CoC-funded grantees.
 - If an error on the Renewal Project Scoring Sheet is identified, DMA will work with the Funding Committee to resolve that error. In this situation, a revised Scoring Sheet will be circulated and posted on the CoC's website.
- In the event that a grantee is not satisfied with the outcome of an issue raised, the grantee may opt
 to submit a formal renewal scoring appeal. All renewal scoring appeals will be discussed,
 deliberated and decided by the Funding Committee. If the project applicant is not satisfied with the
 outcome of the appeal, they may submit a final appeal to the non-conflicted Governing Board
 members.
- At the conclusion of the renewal project scoring process, each project will have a score, which will be used to inform the ranking and tiering process.
- The ability and methodology for evaluating expansion projects will be determined based on the timeline of each project's contract and expansion activities.
 - Note: projects that have been approved for consolidation by the HUD Field Office will be scored as individual projects, as they are submitted as individual projects within esnaps.
 The Funding Committee will make decision regarding the ranking of the "surviving project".

The CoC will also evaluate HMIS, Coordinated Entry, and Planning grants including, but not limited to, evaluation of compliance with HUD requirements.

Renewal Scoring Appeal

If the grantee raises an issue that cannot be resolved with the CoC Consultant and/or PA-HMIS IT Specialist, the grantee may request to have the CoC's Funding Committee consider their specific situation. Examples may include: loss of points due circumstances very specific to your project type, outcomes typical of projects operating within their first full year, outcomes typical of projects with specific subpopulations, etc. Any grantees wishing to appeal to the Funding Committee must make their request within the timeline specified by the CoC, following the instructions provided by the CoC consultant. The appeal request will ask the appellant to describe the specific situation, reference the relevant scoring criteria and provide compelling information and/or documentation for consideration. The Funding Committee will evaluate any requests received and make a determination regarding the disposition of the appeal; grantees will be informed by email of the outcome of their appeal.

If a renewal project applicant submits an appeal to the Funding Committee and is not satisfied with the outcome of their appeal, the applicant can appeal to the Non-conflicted Governing Board members. The decision of these Board members will be considered final.

Renewal Project Reallocation

As stated earlier in this document, the Eastern PA CoC will use project evaluation and scoring to determine which projects should be allocated funds under the CoC NOFA Competition. The CoC will employ a reallocation process aimed at the following:

- Determining which projects should continue to receive funding based upon performance, meeting CoC needs and furthering HUD and/or CoC priorities;
- Determining which projects are underperforming and whether their current funding, in full or in part, may be better utilized if reallocated to another project;
- Determining whether projects are cost effective and, if not, whether the project, in full or in part, should be reallocated; and
- Identifying whether CoC funds are being fully utilized by each project. If there is a history of
 underspending, the Funding Committee will determine if funding should be partially reduced
 (reallocated) and/or if a reallocation plan should be developed to ensure all funding awarded to the
 CoC is furthering progress to reduce and end homelessness.

Projects subject to reallocation will be provided with an opportunity to submit a reallocation appeal, as indicated within the appeal process noted below.

Reallocation of Underperforming Projects

Low performing projects (based on a project's outcomes) will be considered for reallocation, as well as projects scoring the least number of points for two consecutive years (based on outcomes and/or grant management related findings) will be considered for reallocation. "Projects scoring the least number of points" is defined as renewal projects with scores in the bottom 5 of all renewal projects scored, not otherwise de-funded through the CoC funding process. To be considered for reallocation, a project would need to have operated long enough to be competitively ranked for two years. Underperforming projects will be notified by letter following the HUD CoC Competition that their renewal project did not meet scoring/performance expectations. The project applicant will be expected to respond to the letter. Technical Assistance will be offered to all underperforming projects.

Reallocation of Projects Based on Cost Effectiveness

The CoC's renewal scoring process includes the evaluation of a project's cost effectiveness. If it is determined that a project's budget exceeds the typical costs of similar projects, additional information to explain the higher costs may be requested from the grantee. In some circumstances, the Funding Committee may determine that a partial reallocation of CoC-funds is appropriate.

Reallocation of Projects Based on Underspending

The CoC's renewal scoring process includes the evaluation of a project's spend down of grant funds. If it determined that a project has spent less than 90%, or has greater than \$10,000 underspent, during the last fully completed grant year, the project may be considered for full or partial reallocation. In addition, projects with a pattern of underspending (2 or more years) will be notified by letter following the HUD CoC

Competition that their renewal project did not meet scoring/performance expectations. The project applicant will be expected to formally respond to the letter. Technical Assistance will be offered to projects.

Reallocation for Other Reasons

The Eastern PA CoC will also consider reallocation of projects for other reasons, including:

- Lack of need/change in need within the CoC for the project
 - Assessment of CoC need will be informed by Coordinated Entry and CoC Gaps Analysis data
- Funds needed to respond to an urgent/emerging issue within the CoC
- Monitoring indicates serious problems with the project, which could include a lack of compliance with CoC policies such as housing first, following the CoC's written standards, and following Coordinated Entry policies/ procedures

Reallocation Appeal

Any project applicant subject to full or partial reallocation may appeal this decision. There are up to two opportunities to appeal, as described below. All appeals must be submitted within 24 hours of receiving a reallocation notification. To submit an appeal, grantees will follow instructions provided by the CoC consultant.

Any applicant appealing a reallocation decision will first appeal to the Funding Committee. The Funding Committee will review additional documentation submitted by the applicant along with the appeal request. The Funding Committee will consider the supporting documentation and offer a decision within 24 hours after they meet to discuss the appeal.

If the project applicant is not satisfied with the Funding Committee's decision regarding their appeal, the applicant can appeal to the Non-conflicted Governing Board members. The decision of these Board members will be considered final.

New Project Selection

As part of the annual CoC NOFA Competition, the Eastern PA CoC may identify funds available for new projects. The CoC is committed to ensuring an open and transparent process for the selection of new projects. As such, where funding availability permits, the CoC will issue new project solicitations as needed for new projects to be distributed widely to interested parties.

New Project Priorities

In order to determine priorities for new projects, the CoC's consultant (DMA) will analyze data from the Coordinated Entry System Community Queue, the Point-in-Time Count and the CoC's Housing Inventory Chart and other relevant sources as available and appropriate in order to create a gaps analysis. The gaps analysis will be supplemented with input from the Governing Board and

RHABs. This information will be presented to the Funding Committee for review, discussion and determination of the CoC funding priorities and for other funding opportunities when possible.

Distribution of New Project Notice of Intent

In an effort to identify potential applicants for new projects, the CoC intends to issue a Notice of Intent form and encourage organizations interested in applying for new CoC-funding to respond. This will allow the CoC to determine if additional outreach needs to occur in order to identify an applicant to pursue funding aligned to the CoC's funding priorities.

In addition, the NOI process will allow the CoC to identify potential applicants that have not previously applied for CoC funding, as these applicants might need a higher level of technical assistance in submitting an application to the CoC.

Distribution of New Project Solicitations

DMA will draft the new project solicitation and once approved by the Funding Committee, will release a new project Request For Proposal (RFP) to the public. The CoC will work to identify multiple outlets for distribution of the solicitations, including through the CoC's website, email distribution list, Workplace by Facebook, as well as those of related and partner organizations throughout the region and the state.

The new project solicitation will emphasize that new project applicants must incorporate data demonstrating local unmet needs. DMA will provide a new project webinar that presents the unmet needs/gaps analysis data. The webinar will be recorded and made available along with the accompanying slide deck providing the data presented.

Review of New Project Pre-Applications

New project solicitations will request that those interested in applying submit a pre-application for CoC review. The information to be included in the pre-application will be detailed in the new project solicitation.

All pre-applications submitted by the deadline stated in the new project solicitation will be reviewed by the Funding Committee using a standardized scoring tool. The Funding Committee can request additional information from the applicants where clarification would be helpful in the decision-making process. For each pre-application submitted, the Funding Committee will make a determination as to whether or not the project should be included with the CoC's funding request through the CoC NOFA Competition. The Funding Committee also has the ability to conditionally approve a project based on the applicant making requested changes to the proposed project. This may include an increase or decrease in units, budget changes, expansion of geography (when needed and possible), etc.

All agencies submitting pre-applications will be notified in writing via email regarding the CoC's decision to include their proposal among ranked projects within the CoC's funding request to HUD. In addition, the CoC will publicly post a list of new project pre-applications received, noting which were selected for inclusion on the Eastern PA CoC Priority List, as well as the amount of funding approved.

Upon selection, new project applicants must submit a new project application through the HUD e-snaps system in a timely manner and within the deadline established by the CoC.

Appeal New Project Selection Decision

New project applicants not selected for inclusion in the CoC's Consolidated Application may appeal this decision. There are up to two opportunities to appeal, as described below. All appeals must be submitted within 24 hours of receiving project selection notification. To submit an appeal, grantees will follow instructions provided by the CoC consultant.

Any applicant appealing the CoC's project selection decision will first appeal to the Funding Committee. The Funding Committee will review the justification for the appeal and/or documentation submitted for reconsideration. The Funding Committee will reconsider the funding decision and provide a response within 24 hours after they meet to discuss the appeal.

If the project applicant is not satisfied with the Funding Committee's decision regarding their appeal, the applicant can appeal to the Non-conflicted Governing Board members. The decision of these Board members will be considered final.

Ranking of Projects for the Priority List

Project Ranking

The CoC expects that the CoC NOFA will require the CoC to rank projects included on the Priority List. As part of this process, the CoC anticipates that projects will be sorted into either Tier 1 or Tier 2. In past CoC Competitions, projects placed into Tier 2 have been individually scored by HUD in order to determine if they will receive funding.

The CoC's ranking "rules" over the last several years have included the following principles:

- The ranking process will begin by ranking all renewal projects in their descending score, as determined through the renewal scoring process.
- Renewal projects that have not operated throughout the entire "look back" period (the most recently completed HUD SPM cycle October 1 to September 30th) will not be competitively ranked; instead these projects will be ranked at the bottom of Tier 1.
- Projects that support CoC infrastructure and operations will be ranked at the bottom of Tier 1. This
 includes HMIS and Coordinated Entry funding. Planning grants are not ranked.
- The Funding Committee may opt to review performance data across multiple years for renewal projects ranked in Tier 2. Projects with a history of poor performance may be ranked lower than projects with one year of poor performance, even if the renewal score is higher than a project that has not had performance issues in recent years.
- Based on the CoC priorities and unmet needs, regional priorities identified by each RHAB, and the quality of new project applicant, the Funding Committee will determine how to incorporate the

new projects into the overall ranking. The Funding Committee reserves the right to rank new projects in Tier 1 and/or Tier 2.

Applicant Notification & Public Posting

All applicants will be notified of the results of the ranking process according to the deadline established in the CoC Competition NOFA. Applicants will be notified regarding the project's final budget submitted, rank order on the Priority List, project placement into Tier 1 or Tier 2, or the rejection of their project for inclusion on the Priority List. The CoC will provide notification in writing via email. The CoC will also publicly post information on ranking and tiering of projects and the list of projects accepted or rejected for inclusion on the Priority List on the CoC's website.

Appeal to HUD

If the grantee or project applicant is not satisfied with the outcome of their appeal, the HUD CoC NOFA provides project applicants an opportunity to appeal to HUD. Agencies interested in appealing to HUD should carefully review the eligibility criteria and appeal process established by HUD and described in the annual CoC NOFA. In past CoC Competition NOFAs, this appeal has been limited to "eligible project applicants that attempted to participate in their CoC planning process and believe they were denied the right to participate in a reasonable manner."

In order to ensure that all project applicants have the opportunity to participate in the CoC's planning process and to provide input in the CoC's funding process, the CoC has/will provide the following opportunities:

- Circulation of the prior year's Renewal Scoring Sheet, with an opportunity to provide feedback and input on scoring criteria.
- The CoC's ranking criteria will be distributed prior to project scoring.
- Project applicants will have the ability to review and question the data to be used for project evaluation and scoring (the "Renewal Scoring Calculator").
- The CoC will provide a new project application and scoring criteria in order to score all new project applications in a consistent and transparent method.
- Updates will be provided by the CoC during in-person CoC meetings, during RHAB meetings, and via written and electronic communications.
- The CoC provides an appeal policy for any project applicant not selected for funding.



Thank you for your written response to the CoC, submitted on September 3, 2021, regarding YWCA's PA0885 Liberty House PSH Project scoring in the bottom 5 of all renewal projects (score 53.0) in the 2021 CoC renewal scoring process.

The Eastern PA CoC is reaching out to advise that, in addition to the YWCA PA0885 Liberty House PSH project scoring in the bottom 5 of all renewal projects and having extremely low occupancy/ utilization, over the past several months, the CoC has become aware of several practices YWCA has been engaged in that are not in compliance with its grant agreement with HUD for CoC Program funding, nor compliant with the CoC's Policies and Procedures. Per YWCA's non-compliance with its HUD CoC Program grant agreement and with the Eastern PA CoC's Policies, coupled with the low renewal score achieved by the PA0885 Liberty House PSH project, the CoC has made the decision to reallocate the project's full budget of \$223,110. The issues that have come to the CoC's attention are described below:

Not Operating the Liberty House PSH Project in alignment with Housing First Approach

- The CoC met with the YWCA team in spring 2019 and issued a written follow-up letter in May 2019 (attached to this correspondence) regarding the CoC's adoption of Housing First Approach and provision of several trainings to support organizations adopt housing first/ implement their programs in alignment with housing first. Links to recordings and powerpoint slides for said trainings (Motivational Interviewing, Harm Reduction in Housing First, Intro to Trauma Informed Care, and Working with Opioid Use Disorder) were provided to you to ensure your team had sufficient understanding in Housing First Approach.
- YWCA made a commitment to operating this project in alignment with Housing First. Below are screenshots pulled directly from the renewal application you submitted to HUD committing to operating this project in alignment with the CoC's Housing First Policy.
 - Liberty House PSH is a site based permanent supportive housing program for those with a documented substance abuse disorder. Participants must fit the definition of literally homeless. Chronically homeless individuals will be prioritized. The program will operate in alignment with the CoCs policy of housing first.

- It has come to the CoC's attention that the PA0885 Liberty House PSH project screens households
 out of the program/ does not enroll households who are actively using substances despite your
 having committed to not screen people out based on active or history of substance use in your
 application to HUD.
- It has come to the CoC's attention that there are clients/ households in the community who are eligible for the Liberty House PSH project, but that the YWCA has determined it will not serve/ enroll in the Liberty House PSH project because of various reasons determined by the organization, not by CoC Program funding guidelines nor Eastern PA CoC Policies.

Not Operating the Liberty House PSH Project in alignment with the CoC's Written Standards for Eligibility and Prioritization

- The CoC met with the YWCA team in spring 2019 and issued a written follow-up letter in May 2019
 providing links to information and webinar recordings about Eligibility and Documentation; and
 the new Chronically Homeless Definition, Documentation, and Prioritization to ensure your
 team had sufficient understanding of how to operate a CoC Program funded PSH project that is
 dedicated to serving chronically homeless households.
- Below is a screenshot pulled directly from YWCA's renewal application submitted to HUD identifying this project as Dedicated to serving households experiencing chronic homelessness.

As a Chronic Dedicated project, YWCA's PA0885 PSH project must enroll project participants
according to the Eastern PA CoC's prioritization standards for chronic dedicated PSH projects
beginning at the bottom of page 31 of the CoC's Written Standards:

Below is a blurb from the Written Standards capturing the spirit of the prioritization standards for PSH projects.

The highest priority households for PSH enrollment are individuals and families who meet HUD's definition of chronic homelessness, have the longest length of time homeless (e.g., actual length of time homeless, not length of time on the By Name List in PA HMIS), and have been identified as having severe service needs, as defined by VI-SPDAT score.

- It has come to the CoC's attention that YWCA connects with households residing in institutional settings or with family or friends who are ineligible for the Liberty House PSH project by virtue of not being literally homeless, and advises the households to phone into Coordinated Entry requesting a referral to emergency shelter in order to become eligible after having a one night stay in emergency shelter/ one night of literal homelessness. Not only is this an egregious violation of eligibility and the CoC's prioritization standards, it is counter to directives from HUD that state, CoCs must coordinate with state or local discharge planning efforts to ensure people exiting institutions (i.e., jails/prisons/hospitals, mental health facilities, or other institutional settings) are not released directly to the streets, emergency shelters, or other McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance programs. Further, this practice extends the homelessness of the dozens of Lycoming County households who are literally homeless and eligible for this project but who are not being offered enrollment in the project.
- In preparing this communication, the CoC team filtered the Coordinated Entry By Name List on for Lycoming County and identified not less than 18 literally homeless female-headed households who self-identified as having a disabling condition. When the DMA team reviewed the CE Intake Notes for these 18 households, there were no CE Intake notes in the system for any of these 18 households, indicating that YWCA Liberty House PSH project has either not reached out to engage these potentially eligible households or is not entering CE Intake notes in HMIS according to Coordinated Entry expectations. In addition to these literally homeless households, there were not less than nine households meeting Category 4 definition of homelessness who self-identified as having a disabling condition. The Coordinated Entry By Name List indicates that there are more households eligible for the YWCA Liberty House PSH project than the project has capacity to serve. Yet, the project hasn't maintained occupancy/ utilization, and YWCA is engaging ineligible households to fill vacancies.
- In preparing this communication, the CoC team ran an enrollment report in HMIS for the Liberty House PSH project and identified that 18 households exited the project since 10/1/20, all of whom were enrolled in the Liberty House PSH project for less than one year, three of whom exited the project directly back to homelessness. PSH is a non time-limited service-intensive intervention designed and prioritized for households with the longest histories of homelessness and most complex vulnerabilities and barriers, such that they are expected to need supportive housing for many years. In addition to the three households who were exited directly to homelessness, four households who exited the project subsequently phoned back into Coordinated Entry seeking homeless prevention, emergency shelter, and rapid re-housing assistance after exiting the Liberty House PSH project. These extremely brief enrollments in this project, coupled with project participants being exited to homelessness, coupled with nearly half of all those who exited the project subsequently phoning back into Coordinated Entry seeking homeless assistance, is a key indicator that YWCA is not operating this project in alignment with Housing First Approach principles and/or not meeting the needs of the households it serves. A table summarizing the CoC's findings can be found attached to this communication, which also includes CE Intake Notes documenting YWCA's practice of engaging

with non-homeless households and advising them to phone into Coordinated Entry to get on the CE BNL or get one night stay in an emergency shelter in order to become eligible for the project.

The actions described above are major violations of your CoC program agreement with HUD and are operationally misaligned with Eastern PA CoC policies. These issues are compounded by the project's low occupancy/ utilization and low score in the 2021 renewal scoring process. For these reasons, the CoC is reallocating the YWCA PA0885 Liberty House PSH project.

The CoC's Funding Process and Policies, which includes its Appeal Policy, is attached. Per the Appeal Policy, if you decide to appeal, you must send an email within 24 hours of receipt of this communication to easterncoc@pennsylvaniacoc.org with the subject line, "Eastern PA CoC: Appeal to CoC Funding Committee". The email should provide any relevant rationale or documentation for consideration.

While this letter has focused on the YWCA PA0885 Liberty Housing PSH, some of the issues described above are related to the organization's implementation of the project, which raised additional concerns regarding the implementation of the YWCA PA0886 Liberty Options RRH project. While the Funding Committee did not opt to reduce or reallocate the Rapid Re-Housing project this year, our expectations are that the practices outlined above are addressed by the YWCA and that all program operations are aligned to the policies of HUD and the Eastern PA CoC.

Dear Dawn and YWCA Team:

The Eastern PA CoC Funding Committee met yesterday to review the appeal submitted by the YWCA. Upon review of the letter and supporting documents that were submitted, the Committee has upheld their decision to reallocate the PSH funding during the FY2021 CoC NOFO process.

While the YWCA appeal indicated that "Liberty House PSH is fully committed to operating in alignment with the Housing First approach", the Funding Committee identified contradictions to housing first within the appeal letter and supporting documents.

Housing First is a requirement defined within CoC policy, the CoC renewal project application submitted to HUD, and the CoC's Written Standards. As such, it is the belief of this Committee that the YWCA is not operating in compliance of the Written Standards. In addition, notes within Coordinated Entry/ HMIS point to violations of following the CoC's prioritization for assistance.

In regards to YWCA Liberty House losing points through the CoC renewal scoring process due to reducing occupancy during COVID, HUD and the CoC released guidance about improving safety at sites configured like Liberty House. This includes strategies like schedules to limit interactions among different households during meal times, setting bathroom schedules, creating expectations for client to spend more time in rooms, etc. If these types of strategies could not be deployed, the YWCA could have submitted an appeal during the renewal scoring process to explain.

The information reported in your appeal validates the CoC's concern about the turnover of units at Liberty House, considering this is a permanent, non time-limited housing program. It was stated that clients exited the program for reasons that included "wanting access to other housing assistance" and "some individuals who are aware that they may get funding elsewhere to live in their own houses offsite would rather do so". The data suggests that many households are exiting Liberty House as quickly as possible, regardless if they have the support needed to successfully live independently.

While your letter questioned the CoC's ability to reallocate this program, the CoC's funding policies state that the Eastern PA CoC will also consider reallocation of projects for other reasons, including:

Assessment of CoC need will be informed by Coordinated Entry and CoC Gaps Analysis data; Monitoring indicates serious problems with the project, which could include a lack of compliance with CoC policies such as housing first, following the CoC's written standards, and following Coordinated Entry policies/ procedures.

While the Funding Committee did not vote to overturn its reallocation decision, the YWCA may appeal to the non-conflicted members of the Governing Board. Thank you for your written response to the CoC, submitted to the Eastern PA CoC Funding Committee on September 3, 2021, regarding underspending and low utilization / occupancy for the Housing Authority of Monroe County's PA0219 – Shelter Plus Care MC Project.

The Eastern PA CoC has made the decision to fully reallocate CoC Program funding for this project. This action was determined to be necessary based on the written and verbal correspondence between the CoC and Housing Authority of Monroe County about underutilization and underspending. Some of the project's vacancies date back to 2019, despite there being a multitude of households on the Coordinated Entry By Name List who are eligible for this project.

As stated in the CoC's September 3rd communication, at that time, there were 3 households on the Coordinated Entry By Name List who reported being chronically homeless; 15 households experiencing literal homelessness reporting having a disabling condition and who scored an 8 or higher on the VISPDAT. For these 15 households, there are no Coordinated Entry Intake Notes in HMIS documenting HAMC has reached out to these clients to screen them for eligibility/ offer assistance.

As a CoC Program funded Chronic dedicated project, Housing Authority of Monroe County's PA0219 – Shelter Plus Care Project must enroll participation according to the Eastern PA CoC's prioritization standards for chronic dedicated PSH projects beginning at the bottom of page 31 of the CoC's Written Standards:

https://pennsylvaniacoc.org/sites/default/files/attachments/2020-12/Eastern%20PA%20CoC%20Written%20Standards%20Revised%2011.16.20.pdf Below is a blurb from the Written Standards capturing the spirit of the prioritization standards for PSH projects.

The highest priority households for PSH enrollment are individuals and families who meet HUD's definition of chronic homelessness, have the longest length of time homeless (e.g., actual length of time homeless, not length of time on the By Name List in PA HMIS), and have been identified as having severe service needs, as defined by VI-SPDAT score.

While the CoC values its partnership with the Monroe County Housing Authority, the decision to reallocate project funding is being made to fund other projects with the capacity to engage and enroll households experiencing homelessness.

Thank you for submitting an application to the Eastern PA CoC under the FY2021 Continuum of Care New Permanent Housing Project RFP. YWCA Northcentral PA's application was reviewed by the Funding Committee.

The CoC had \$1,252,499 amount of CoC Bonus and reallocated funds available and received 7 eligible new permanent housing project applications totaling \$2,153,485 in requested funds. Due to limited funding available for new projects, unfortunately YWCA Northcentral PA's application was not selected for funding. In addition, the Funding Committee had some concerns about the proposed project. The proposed model does not appear to align with HUD requirements around TH-RRH including the guideline that participants may choose to receive only one component (i.e., a client does not need to go through TH first to access RRH). In addition, the project did not appear to meet HUD's threshold requirement for TH-RRH related to the ratio of TH to RRH units. Please note that these guidelines related to TH-RRH projects were addressed in the Essenting From Sept. 15, 2021, which is posted on the CoC website NOFO page.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Valley Health Partners Community Health Center (hereinafter referred to as "VHP") operates the Street Medicine program (hereinafter referred to as "Street Medicine Program"). The Street Medicine Program is designed to improve the health of, and provide continuity of care for, patients with unstable housing situations. In addition to the financial contribution made by VHP directly, the program is funded by a Community-Based Health Care Program Grant (hereinafter referred to as "Grant") provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Health (hereinafter referred to as "DOH").

The Lehigh Conference of Churches, located at 457 W. Allen Street, Allentown, Pennsylvania, (hereinafter referred to as "Community Partner") has been identified as an organization serving individuals who may benefit from the Street Medicine Program, and the Community Partner agrees to provide space within its facility for VHP to operate its Street Medicine Program.

VHP and Community Partner agree to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MOU") and endeavor to foster a cooperative arrangement for the provision of medical services for the community that it jointly serves. Such services shall be rendered based on the following:

UNDERSTANDING OF THE PARTIES

- 1. **INCORPORATION.** The parties hereby incorporate by reference the recitals set forth above.
- LOCATION. The Community Partner shall provide, at no cost to VHP, adequate space at
 its facility, on mutually agreed upon dates and times, for VHP to provide Medical
 Services to the homeless clients served by the Community Partner (hereinafter referred
 to as the "Patient" or "Patients"). The term "Medical Services" as used in this MOU is
 defined in Section 5.
- 3. **AS IS CONDITION.** The space shall be provided to VHP by the Community Partner in an "as is" conditionand VHP shall make no repairs, alterations, installations, decorations or add any equipment without the prior written consent of the Community Partner.
- 4. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS. The Community Partner shall maintain at its sole cost, liability insurance insuring against such losses and risks and in such amounts as are generally deemed adequate and customary for the business in which the Community Partner is engaged. The Community Partner shall provide a certificate of insurance confirming compliance with these

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insurance requirements upon request of VHP.

- 5. MEDICAL SERVICES. Medical Services provided at the Community Partner's facility include on basic primary and preventative health services for acute and chronic illnesses (hereinafter referred to as the "Medical Services"). Limited medications, such as antibiotics and acetaminophen, may be made available and administered on-site. All Medical Services shall be delivered without cost to the Community Partner and/or Patients.
- 6. **MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDERS.** All Medical Services provided hereunder by VHP shall be provided by qualified and duly licensed health care professional(s), including physician assistants employed by VHP as well as volunteers (hereinafter referred to as "VHP Providers"). All Medical Services provided by a physician assistant shall be rendered under the supervision of a licensed physician as required by Pennsylvania law.
- 7. **PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE.** All VHP Providers performing Medical Services pursuant to this MOU shall have professional liability insurance coverage in accordance with the requirements of Pennsylvania law.
- 8. BACKGROUND CHECK REQUIREMENTS. VHP will require all VHP representatives performing services purusant to this MOU to maintain active Pennsylvania Child Abuse History clearances. Where VHP has knowledge that a VHP representative does not have an active Pennsylvania Child Abuse History as required by this MOU, such VHP representative shall be prohibited from performing services pursuant to this MOU until such time as an active Pennsylvania Child Abuse History is obtained.
- 9. **SPECIALIZED SERVICES OR EMERGENCY.** In the event of an emergency, VHP will contact 911. VHP shall refer any person requiring specialized services to the appropriate setting and shall arrange transportation through VHP Enabling Services, if necessary.
- 10. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. VHP is, and at all times shall be, in the performance of all services under this MOU, an independent contractor, and not an employee or agent of the Community Partner. All persons engaged in any of the services performed pursuant to this Agreement shall at all times, and in all places, be subject to VHP's sole direction, supervision and control. VHP shall exercise control over the means and manner in which it and its employees and/or volunteers perform the services. Neither party shall have the power or right to bind or obligate the other party, nor shall it hold itself out as having such authority.
- 11. **GRANT REQUIREMENTS.** The parties acknowledge and agree that, pursuant to the requirements of the Grant, any promotional materials (i.e. press releases, news articles, brochures, pamphlets) developed to publicize the availability of the Medical Services shall first be approved in writing by the DOH. Promotional materials must state the source of funding and brochures and pamphlets must also include the DOH logo. All requests for approval of promotional materials must be received by DOH at least three (3) weeks prior to the publication date. The Community Partner agrees to comply with

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all Grant requirements immediately receiving notice of the requirements from VHP. In the event the Community Partner is unwilling or unable to comply, this MOU shall immediately terminate.

- 12. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** The Effective Date of this MOU shall be that date when the last of the parties has executed this MOU as determined by the dates set forth immediately below the respective signatures of VHP and the Community Partner.
- 13. **REPRESENTATIVE.** Each party agrees to designate a representative to be responsible to coordinate the Street Medicine Program and to address any issues that may arise.
- 14. **NOTICE.** Any notice or communication required, permitted, or desired to be given, shall be deemed effectively given when mailed by prepaid certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, addressed as follows:

- 15. **TERMINATION.** Except as otherwise provided above, this MOU may be terminated by either party, at any time, with or without cause with ten (10) days prior written notice to the other party.
- 16. **NO MODIFICATION.** This MOU may be modified or amended only in a writing signed by both parties.
- 17. **NO ASSIGNMENT.** Neither party hereto may assign any of its rights or obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party.
- 18. **COUNTERPARTS.** This MOU may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 19. **EMAIL SIGNATURES.** The parties agree that this MOU may be executed by facsimile signature or email signatures in PDF format, and that such facsimile or email signatures shall have the effect of original signatures relative to this MOU.
