1C-7. PHA Homeless Preference

Documents include the following:

The PHA will offer a preference to any family that has been terminated from its HCV program due to insufficient program funding.

The PHA will offer the following local preferences, treated equally, for Westmoreland County residents:

1. Educational/Training Preference for families that are residents of Westmoreland County where the head of household or spouse are current graduates or current participants in educational (full-time student) or training programs designed to retrain and prepare the individual for the job market. The PHA will require detailed information from the agency or institution providing the education or training. Online classes are not acceptable.
2. Transitional Housing Preference for families that are residents of Westmoreland County and who are participating in a transitional housing program preparing the family to live independently. The PHA will require a letter of referral from the agency or institution providing the transitional housing.
3. Victims of Domestic Violence Preference for families that are residents of Westmoreland County that include victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking who have either been referred by a partnering service agency or consortia or is seeking an emergency transfer under VAWA from the PHA's public housing program or other covered housing program operated by the PHA.
 - a. The PHA will work with the following partnering service agencies:
 - b. Blackburn Center, Greensburg, PA
 - c. Alle-Kiski HOPE Center, Tarentum, PA
 - d. The applicant must have a current Westmoreland County Protection from Abuse (PFA) Order; or
 - e. The applicant must have a current Westmoreland County Protection from Abuse (PFA) Order and the domestic abuse shelter must provide a referral letter that indicates the family has resided at the shelter for at least 30 days. If the applicant meets the 30-day criteria but has moved from the shelter, a determination will be made on a case-by-case basis regarding retention of the preference.
 - f. The applicant must certify that the abuser will not reside with the applicant unless the PHA gives prior written approval.

4. Involuntarily Displaced Preference for a family that is a resident of Westmoreland County who has been permanently displaced from their home or the unit is uninhabitable:
 - a. Government Action including, but not limited to,
 - 1) condemnation,
 - 2) property acquisition,
 - 3) code enforcement,
 - 4) grant activity, or a
 - 5) Federally declared disaster.
 - b. Disasters including, but not limited to:
 - 1) Fire
 - 2) Flood
 - c. Verification must be provided in the form of a notice of displacement or letter of referral from the agency which displaced the applicant (i.e., Red Cross, Salvation Army, etc.).
 - d. With respect to sections a.5) and b. and c. above, the following also applies:

Declared Disasters

In the case of a disaster declared by Westmoreland County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Federal Government, or other governmental entity who has the authority to make a disaster declaration, the Westmoreland County Housing Authority reserves the right for its Executive Director (or designee) to modify its preference system and permit Westmoreland County resident applicants who have been directly affected by the disaster to be housed immediately, and before all other applicants on the waiting list. However, applicants must meet all screening and other applicable program requirements prior to admission. The duration of such modification shall be at the discretion of the Executive Director (or designee), but in all instances, will automatically expire 180 days after the modification was instituted. Any other provisions of this Administrative Plan can also be suspended during the emergency at the discretion of the Executive Director so long as the provision suspended does not violate law. Where regulatory waivers are necessary for any other provisions, they shall be promptly requested of the HUD Assistant Secretary for Public and Indian Housing.



5. Homeless Preference for a family that is a resident of Westmoreland County who
 - a. Lacks fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence; and,
 - b. Has primary nighttime residence that is a supervised public or privately operated shelter designated to provide temporary living; and,
 - c. Provides documentation from the shelter that indicates the family has resided at the shelter for at least 30 days. If the applicant meets the 30-day criteria but has moved from the shelter, a determination will be made on a case-by-case basis regarding retention of the preference. The applicant will be considered to be “homeless” if one of the following criteria exists:
 - 1) The applicant has moved from the shelter but has not relocated to permanent housing (i.e., is staying with relatives or friends).
 - 2) Prior to processing the application, the PHA may require a second certification from the same source that the applicant is not yet permanently housed and has been continuously homeless or temporarily housed since claiming the preference.
 - 3) If a family is in transitional housing and wishes the PHA to hold the family’s place on the waiting list, a statement is required from the agency providing the transitional housing.
 - d. Verification must be provided in the form of a referral letter from the homeless shelter provider.
6. Veteran’s Preference will be extended to residents of Westmoreland County:
 - a. Current members of the U. S. Armed Forces
 - b. Veterans with an honorable discharge
 - c. Spouses or surviving spouses of veterans
 - d. Dependent parent (age 62 or older) or a child (person with disabilities) of a veteran
 - e. A divorced spouse of a veteran who is the legal guardian of a child of a veteran.
 - f. The PHA will require U. S. government documents which indicate that the applicant qualifies under the above definition:
 - 1) Discharge papers (Form DD214 showing honorable), and

- 2) Proof of veteran benefits such as pension, disability, or medical benefits; or
 - 3) Any documents verifying current service status.

7. Certain Moderate Rehabilitation Participants Preference for families currently residing in a unit which is overcrowded or under-occupied and there is no applicable unit available in the moderate rehabilitation development or other moderate rehabilitation developments within the PHA's jurisdiction.
 8. Public Housing Self-Sufficiency Program Participants Preference for families who maintain full-time employment for 12 consecutive months while under the Family Self-Sufficiency Contract of Participation. Limited to five families per year according to date and time of application.
 9. Tenants Terminated Due to Insufficient Program Funding Preference will be offered to any family that has been terminated from any WCHA-administered program due to insufficient program funding.
 10. Foster Youth to Independence Program Preference: The PHA will provide a selection preference on the PHA's HCV waiting list for FYI voucher holders who are terminated due to the 36-month limit on assistance.

If during the eligibility interview it is determined that the applicant is no longer eligible for any of the above local preferences, the applicant will assume position on the regular list based on date and time of application.

Based on underperformance and underspending of the Cameron/Elk Behavioral and Developmental Programs PA0307 AHEAD grant and PA0670 Home Again Grant (which were consolidated into one grant PA0307 AHEAD as part of the FY21 CoC Competition) over the past several years, the CoC has made the decision to partially reallocate this project and reduce the total budget by 20% (reduce total consolidated budget of \$233,943 by \$46,788 for a new total budget of \$187,155). As part of your FY2022 CoC renewal application, you will be eligible to apply for this reduced amount of \$187,155. This reduced budget would go into effect for your FY22 HUD grant (grant starting in 2023).

This determination was made due to underperformance and underspending as outlined below:

- **Underperformance:** PA0670 has been in the bottom 20% of projects scored for the past 3 years. PA0307 has been in the bottom 20% of projects scored for the past 6 years. Note: Agency requested a consolidation of two grants (PA0307 and PA0670), which will be effective in fall 2022.
- **Underspending:** PA0670 has not met the CoC's threshold for spending (90% spending) for the past 3 fully completed years (FY22 renewal evaluation scoring: 77%, FY21 renewal evaluation scoring: 83% and FY20 renewal evaluation scoring: 76%). PA0307 did not meet the CoC's threshold for spending (90% spending) in the FY22 evaluation (83%). Agency provided up to date spending information for current grant cycle and neither PA0307 nor PA0670 are projected to spend 90% or more during current grant cycles, which end in fall 2022 (PA0307 projected to spend 80% and PA0670 projected to spend 89%). Note: Agency requested a consolidation of two grants (PA0307 and PA0670), which will be effective in fall 2022.

This decision was recommended by the CoC Funding Committee and approved by the Non-Conflicted Governing Board.

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is an appeal request for the reallocation letter received by Cameron/Elk Behavioral and Developmental Programs on August 12, 2022.

Cameron/Elk Behavioral and Developmental Programs has continued to make changes in an effort to improve our performance outcomes and spend the monies allocated for our grants. We have continued to reach out to DMA for technical assistance when we needed, and we have more recently requested a consolidation of our 2 grants in an effort to remove some barriers we identified. We are also working against the ERAP program that was able to pay landlords rents that were well above any FMR we could offer. We are still trying to mend relationships with the landlords who were affected by the eviction moratorium as well. We are working tirelessly to rebuild relationships by reminding landlords that we were the only program who paid rents consistently through the entire pandemic.

The consolidation we were granted will only begin in October of 2022, that is why we are asking for a delay in the reallocation. What we are proposing is that we be granted an additional year to see if the changes we made will resolve the underspending of the grants. Our reasoning is that if this consolidation does resolve the spending issue and we end the next grant cycle on target with our spending, how will we manage to keep the participants housed with a budget decrease the following grant cycle of almost \$50,000.00.

In regard to the performance measures we have implemented a process to better conduct annual assessments within the 30 day window. We have opened up our PATH Program to serve all ages so we will have more staff available to make a home visit in the event the Housing Specialist is not available. However, we do serve the most vulnerable population. Our participants disabilities are Serious Mental Illnesses. This means that employment income for our participants is random at best. We are serving a population that falls between Social Security eligible and employable. Their income is usually zero. We have all participants with no income apply for all income benefits available, but most are not determined to be ineligible. We also try to roll them over to public or housing choice voucher programs, but in our area, there is a minimum rent of \$50 for these units that isn't affordable on a zero income. Some of our participants have been evicted from these units for that very reason. We work with a population that cycles in their mental illness; some even self-medicate causing addiction issues. We are lucky to have 20%-30% with an income that can increase, but most decrease or don't exist at all. Insurance is another struggle, and custody issues often leave us unable to obtain all documentation for the children in the household. We try to increase our performance measures but with this vulnerable of a population we struggle and will continue to struggle with the scoring aspect of this. I can already tell you we began the next scoring cycle missing some of this information on household members who have since moved on or exited the program without ever providing a social security number or verifying a race/ethnicity.

In conclusion, we wish you would reconsider your decision to reallocate our funding at this point and please grant us one more year to see if we are able to make our efforts work so we can continue to serve this population and provide them with the best chance they will have at safe and affordable housing. Thank you for your time in this matter

You were notified on August 12, 2022 that the CoC Funding Committee made the decision to partially reallocate the above project (reducing the total budget of \$233,943 for the consolidated projects by \$46,788 for a new total budget of \$187,155). This decision was based on underperformance and underspending.

Your agency submitted an appeal related to this decision to the CoC Funding Committee. The CoC Funding Committee met on August 24, 2022 to review your appeal. Upon careful review of the appeal and thoughtful discussion about the items raised in your appeal letter, the CoC Funding Committee has decided to deny the appeal and uphold the decision to partially reallocate this project.

This determination was based on the following:

- **Data Quality and Performance:** The poor data quality of this project has made it difficult for the Funding Committee to accurately assess the effectiveness of this program. In the FY2022 renewal scoring evaluation, this project lost 10 points due to data quality issues (10% of total points). The CoC has not seen improvements in data quality for this project. The CoC has not seen that the agency has remedied existing data quality issues that can be fixed (including missing PII, missing income at entry, missing income at exit, and missing destination). There were no appeals submitted as part of the FY2022 renewal scoring evaluation to indicate any outstanding circumstances related to data quality errors (e.g., agency staff actively working with HMIS team to resolve issues during data clean-up period but was unable to resolve errors in advance of scoring, or specific client situations that resulted in data quality issues). Poor data quality can also impact performance criteria (including income, mainstream benefits, and health insurance criteria), as missing data makes it look like a person has not improved outcomes in the program even if they may have.
- **Right-Sizing the Grant:** The Funding Committee believes that right-sizing the grant to reflect the actual utilization of the project from previous years will allow your organization to perform more strongly and serve participants more effectively. While the Funding Committee is sympathetic to the concerns you raised related to spending challenges (ERAP, landlord engagement, etc.), the Funding Committee also recognizes that these are challenges shared by providers across the CoC.

- **CoC's Responsibility to HUD:** It is an expectation of HUD that CoCs are evaluating projects based on how they improve system performance and reallocating funding from lower performance projects. From the 2022 CoC NOFO:
 - As part of the CoC Application, CoCs must “demonstrate the CoC actively reviews the performance of existing CoC Program funded projects and has a standard process for reallocating funding from lower performing projects to create new high performing projects.”
 - “HUD will prioritize funding for CoCs that have demonstrated the capacity to reallocate funding from lower to higher performing projects.”

The CoC's Funding Process and Policies, which includes its Appeal Policy, is attached. Per the Appeal Policy, if your initial appeal is denied by the Funding Committee, the project applicant may opt to appeal to the Non-Conflicted Board Members. This appeal must be submitted within 24 hours of receiving the Funding Committee's decision. If you wish to send an appeal to the Non-Conflicted Board Members, you must send an email within 24 hours of receipt of this email to westerncoc@pennsylvaniacoc.org with the subject line, “Western PA CoC: Appeal to CoC Non-Conflicted Board”. The email should provide any relevant rationale or documentation for consideration.

Please note that due to this partial reallocation, you will be required to amend and reduce your budget and other corresponding information (households served, units, etc) when completing your 2022 renewal project application in esnaps to reflect this change. The Funding Committee also wishes to note that you would be eligible to apply for expanded/new funds in future years to rebuild capacity of the program, if you are able to resolve the outstanding issues and determine that there is a need for additional funding based on demand.

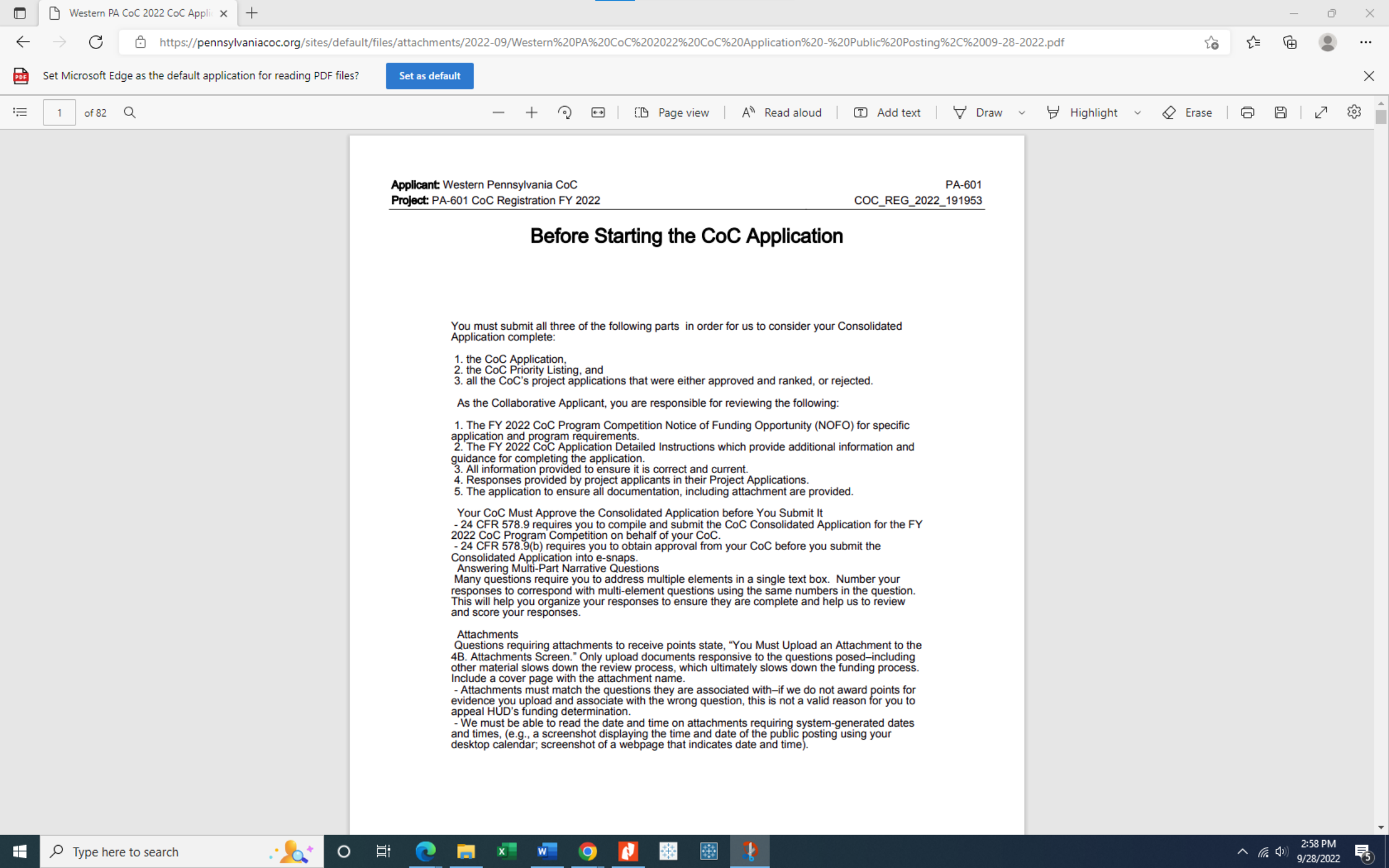

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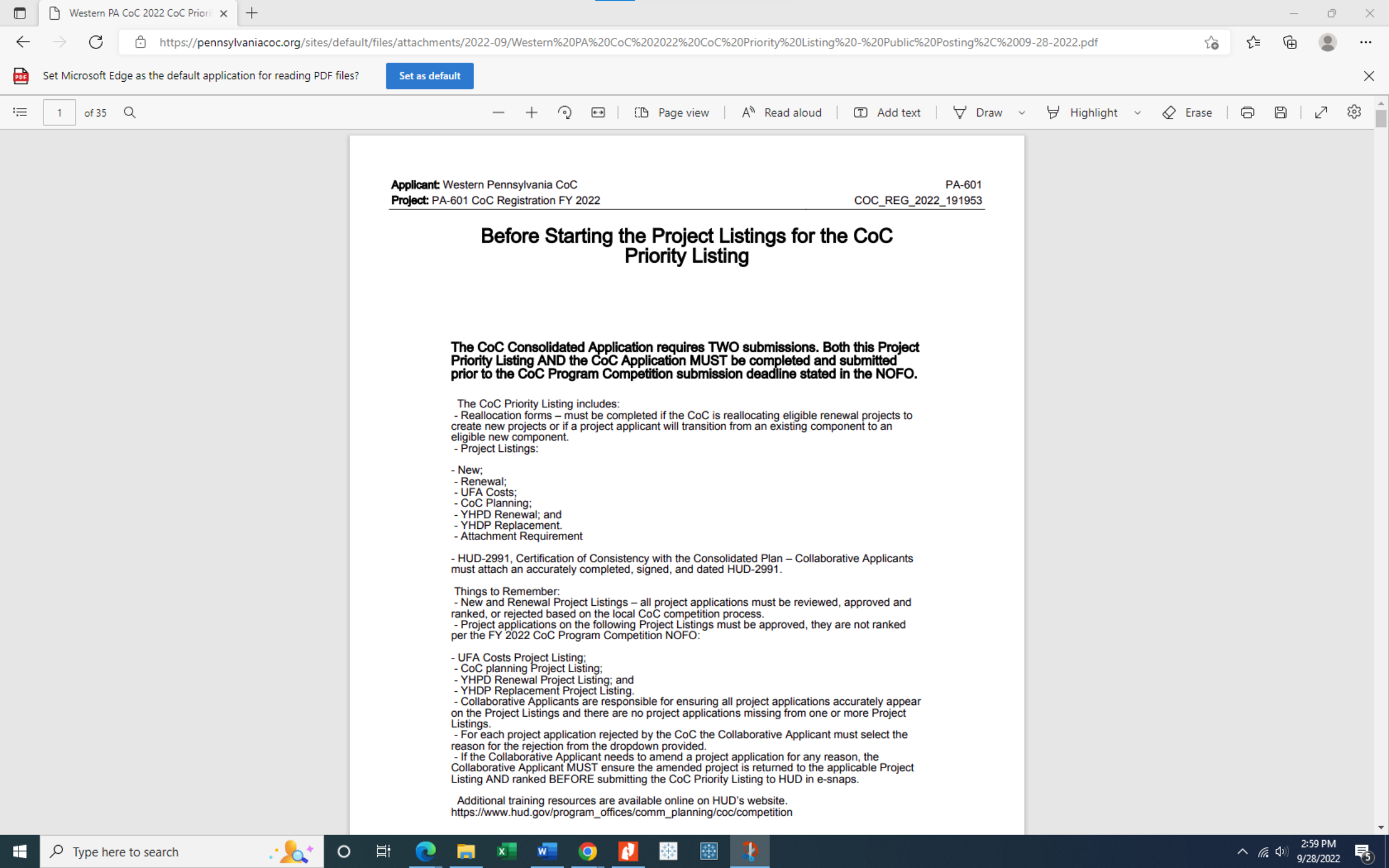

Commitment to provide Subsidized Housing Units

The Crawford County Coalition on Housing Needs has dedicated the use of six subsidized permanent housing units to support the operation of the new Liberty House - PSH project. The building is comprised of four 2-bedroom units and two 3-bedroom units. These units will be available immediately upon the start of the HUD grant term, which is anticipated to be in the late summer/fall 2022.

The property and development of these six units was funded using \$970,530 in grants from HUD, PA Department of Community and Economic Development (HOME), CDBG, and Brownfields. (see attached financial breakdown)

This six-unit property will allow the Crawford County Coalition on Housing Needs to provide permanent housing to families experiencing homelessness. The building is located within walking distance to the elementary school and close to the bus stop. The building is located in downtown Meadville and is in close proximity to grocery stores, schools, hospital, outpatient mental health facilities, community health facilities, daycares, parks & playgrounds, Department of Human Services, as well as many employment opportunities.

In addition, leveraging these units will reduce the length of time homeless for households enrolled, as identifying rental units in partnership with local landlords is a challenge and puts a great strain on families. Due to increasing rental costs, which exceed Fair Market Rent, as well as the limited housing stock in our community, it typically takes 60 – 90 days to locate a decent and affordable multi-family rental unit.
