### Shared Language

Domestic Violence/Intimate Partner Violence

- Can include physical violence, sexual violence, stalking and psychological aggression (including coercive tactics) by a current or former intimate partner.
- DV denotes a pattern of behavior used to gain and maintain power and control over another.

Human Trafficking

• A crime that involves compelling or coercing a person to provide labor or services, or to engage in commercial sex acts using fear, fraud, force, or coercion.

**PCADV** 

• Exploitation of a minor for commercial sex is human trafficking, regardless of whether any form of force, fraud, or coercion was used.













PCAD



- Maintains current protections
- Incorporates economic abuse to the definition of domestic violence (upwards of 99% of DV cases involve some type of economic abuse)
- Establishes a gender-based violence prevention office with a VAWA director at HUD
- Shared economic security related findings for survivors of violence
  - 60% of single women lack economic security
  - 81% of households with single mothers live in economic insecurity
  - 92% of homeless women experienced domestic violence with more 50% citing domestic violence as the direct cause of homelessness
  - Best predictor of a survivor successfully leaving = degree of economic independence
